FINANCE REPORT - JOE BOOTH

For the period ending 7-1-2019 we remain over budget year to date by \$47,000. Not much different from last month. Halfway through the year we address unexpected issues that were not budgeted for. We have to play the hand we are dealt. The budget is simply an educated guesstimate of what we may expect to spend in managing the Community. This is the time of year when we will develop the budget for 2020 and whether there will be an increase in our monthly fee. Please keep in mind that we get a lot for the assessed monthly fee that you would not get in any other community. The one item that inflates our monthly fee is the land lease cost. On an average that is \$73 per unit each month. But when you figure your cost for gas for heating, cooking, and hot water, water, cable, insurance on your unit is included in your monthly fee.....it's still a very good deal. Developing land leased communities is an antiquated way to build condo communities to-

We still have about 10 residents that have not paid the assessment for the roofs of 2019. Their accounts have been sent to the lawyer for collection. Delinquencies are way down. Please feel free to contact me at any time if you would like to review our financials so you will be more aware of what we do with your money, how we manage, and the financial health of Mission Hills.

Despite this uncomfortable, often unpredictable weather, your understaffed and overworked Neighborhood Watch volunteers were out there, for us, protecting, patrolling and reporting... as they always do. A lot of remodeling, repairs and replace work going on in Mission Hills now. This is a good sign and one reason Mission Hills is such a nice place to live. However, too many of the workers trucks are parking illegally, blocking our street that must be kept free and clear for emergency vehicles....and parking on the grass is not an option. Our water sprinkler heads are buried in the grass and get ruined (Our \$\$\$!) Delivery trucks can park for a few minutes to unload heavy items, but not to service or install them. After the "few minutes" the truck or van must move to a "legal" parking area, most commonly across the street or a visitor parking area. Most delivery drivers have no problem with this. It's just something we have to do. Everybody benefits...even the trucks bringing your goodies from Amazon! Thanks.

Why clean out recycles before putting in the bins? The mess created attracts rats, roaches, ants, blowflies and other critters. Money that could be used to replace & repaint your siding as you request, for instance, must be diverted to dealing with the rodents and insects. It's your decision – clean out the containers & get your siding or other such requests tended to OR spend the money dealing with the problems created by the food encrusted containers.

Many times a problem arises with a water heater or circulator pump and you do not get a notice that the water is being turned off. It would take an hour and a half and more to get a notice printed & delivered to each door of the affected phase. The problem can usually be pretty much fixed in that time. Again – do we spend time delivering notices or spend it fixing the problem!

A few days ago a friend & I were outside chatting and she raised the subject of another neighbor who waters her flowers morning and evening, rain or shine; finishing her observation with the comment that it could be worse because that's reclaimed water. My friend was astonished to learn that the water coming out of the hoses is from the same costly source that the water from her kitchen faucet comes from. It's not reclaimed, nor is it well water. So, again, please be conservative with the flower watering. Especially now when we're getting some rain almost every day. Let God take care of the flowers!

Speaking of water, our water bill for Phase 9 has been more than \$1,000 over normal for the last few months. John & our crew have been searching for the cause. Finally found the problems: RUNNING TOILETS! There is no reason for toilets to be left unrepair for months. It only costs a few dollars for the parts & if you can't install them, put in an After Hours Work Order. Normally it takes only about 15 or 20 minutes to install them. And yes the culprits in Phase 9 are going to be charged for the water and sewer overage. It's not fair to the rest of us to have to pay for their negligence.

Quite a number of carport spaces are developing nasty stains from leaking cars. If you have a problem with your vehicle, place a piece of carpet or some other material that's not to unsightly on the area to absorb the fluid. The mess can be cleaned up with some auto parts cleaning fluid and a little scrubbing. Help us keep Mission Hills beautiful!

Last week we had 2 units with absentee owners develop emergencies. Thankfully we had keys to one of them. PLEASE, IF YOU'VE CHANGED THE DOOR LOCKS, BE SURE TO LEAVE A NEW KEY IN THE OFFICE!!!!

You will need to instruct your HVAC company to contact the office on the date of installation, prior to arrival on site. We will take it from there. This only takes a minute of your time and will help us to help you make sure the installation is complete.

NEW INSTALL OF HVAC SYSTEM - APPROVAL FORM

HVAC systems installed at the owner's expense must be in accordance with the following specifications, <u>AFTER SUBMITTING THIS FORM AND RECEIPT OF APPROVAL.</u>

- Install of HVAC unit must be installed by a state licensed HVAC company.
- Supply copy of permit before work can proceed.
- Installs are only to be performed during regular business hours. No weekend installs.
- A Brand New Shroud/Doghouse must be installed
- Must be rodent proof. Screening must be installed and no openings around unit for rodent to enter.
- The condensation line (PVC) must be secured to the roof scupper/ roof drain.
- A New Thermostat is recommended for the inside the unit.
- No tools or debris shall be left on the roof after completion of install.
- All packaging and construction debris must be removed from the property by the contractor.



After we complete our business, we will be available for any questions that you might have regarding the documents.





CARAMEL PUFF CORN (250 degree oven) (submitted by Helen J. Strupczewski)

If you're like me and LOVE caramel popcorn but can't eat it for because of the hulls or whatever reason, I stumbled across this recipe on Pin-trist using PuffCorn.

Ingredients

2 bags Puff Corn Butter Flavor (3.5 ounces bags – 7 ounces needed for recipe)

1 cup butter (do not substitute)

1 cup light brown sugar

1/2 cup light corn syrup

1 teaspoon baking soda

Directions

Preheat oven to 250 degrees F.

Spray a large roasting pan with non-stick cooking spray.

Using a 3 to 4 quart sauce pan bring butter, brown sugar and corn syrup to a boil over medium to medium-high heat, stirring continuously. Once it begins to boil, boil for 2 minutes then add baking soda (the caramel mixture will foam up when baking soda is added). Stir well and remove from heat. Pour evenly over puff corn and mix well, being sure to coat the puff corn evenly.

Bake on middle rack of oven for 45 minutes – stirring every 15 minutes.

When ready, remove from roasting pan and spread caramel corn on wax paper and allow to cool. Once cooled, break any large pieces into smaller bite size pieces – Enjoy!

Store in an airtight container up to 5 days


