of Paradise called Mission Hills will be 50 years old in November. That means that our condos, pool, electric wiring, water pipes, hot water tanks, and our trees are all 50 years old. Of course, some of our trees are fees and our assessment. even older, and these beautiful trees are also causing problems. Over the past 50 years, they have been growing and their roots have managed to extend themselves and wrap around our water pipes and electrical wires.

Two years ago, we had to replace the piping in Phase V. Last year, we had two areas where we had to replace the electrical wiring to some of our condos. This year we had to replace the piping in Phase IV. Within the last couple of months, we have had to replace electrical wiring in two sections that were affected by tree roots causing a power outage.

All this is very expensive, since we must n case you are not aware, our little piece have trees removed, install new wiring, and have it all inspected. That being said, we are still financially stable, and as of June 30, 2021, we are under budget by \$87,000. However, as I mentioned before, this is due to prepaid

Mission Hills Diamond in the Rough

Greetings!

We are good on Gatorade for now, thank you all very much! Shout out to Chad who celebrated a birthday last month!

Mission Hills was featured on the local news due to Hurricane Elsa. The crew was on property while we were cleaning up a fallen tree. I want to say how proud I am of our Maintenance Team for stepping up to the plate once again and getting the job done. I also want to thank the community for their part in helping out.

The pool upgrade has started, and our goal is to have it up and running by Labor Day. Our permitting and engineering study is in process for night swimming. This is needed to determine the total cost for this undertaking.

We are having challenges with electrical lines breaking in the ground due to tree roots. When this happens, it is up to the Maintenance Team to remove the trees and clear a clean path to the electrical substations throughout the community. With that in mind, these tree removals are our top priority.

New Patios: No matter the size of the job or the amount of work being done, make sure the people doing the job are looking ahead when completing the task. We are having challenges with water standing still because patios are not pitched properly.

Sidewalks: Keep in mind that cracks get to the root cause. We are not going to pour cement over tree roots and create the same problem all over again.

New Roofs/New Downspouts: Water is now coming off the roofs instead of laying on top. Also, the HVAC from your unit is now piped to the downspout and not laying on the roof as it was before. Therefore, you have water coming out of the downspout when it is not raining. Once again, keep in mind that this is a 50 year old community, and the landscaping has changed significantly.

Cutting Lawns/Weed Whacking/Edging/Blowing: There is a process to these jobs. Some of our residents have blowers and use them to keep their area clean. We weed whack, edge the property, and blow away the debris first thing in the morning when the heat index is much lower. Our guys walk as much as 12 miles a day to complete this job.





LAW OF THE LAND

MISSION HILLS CONDOMINIUM ASSOCIATION Garden/Flower Bed Planting Guidelines

- 1. All landscaping outside the buildings front, rear, and along carports are part of the common elements. However, homeowners and residents are welcome to do their own landscaping in front and back of their respective units, and along carports, within certain criteria.
- 2. Depth of the flower beds is not to extend more than twelve inches (12") beyond the stucco wings, or to sidewalks in front of units.
- 3. Plants shall not be within six inches (6") of sprinkler heads, water pipes, cables or waste line access caps.
- 4. No growth is to extend over walkways or entrances.
- 5. All plants shall be maintained at a distance no less than twelve inches (12") from any part of the building. The improved air flow aids in preventing wood rot on the siding.
- 6. All plants shall be maintained at a height of no more than the windowsill level. A similar height shall be carried over to carport bed plants.
- 7. Dirt and mulch level of the beds must be maintained at least three inches (3") below any of the wood siding to help decrease termite issues.
- 8. No trees or tree-like shrubs are permitted in beds abutting the buildings. Roots on these types of plants are large and widespread and can cause sever damage to the slab and building structure, as well as pipelines and other utility supply lines.
- 9. Owners who elect to do this landscaping or have acquired a unit with personal landscaping by a previous resident, are required to keep the area trimmed, clear of overgrowth and neat in appearance. Such care is required year-round.
- 10. In the event of ongoing negligence, the MHCA will step in to bring the landscaping components back into compliance at owner's expense.
- 11. When repair or replacement of a utility lateral is required, and a homeowner-installed patio or landscaping is disturbed in the process, repairs and replacement of the patio or landscaping are at the owner's expense.
- 12. Residents may not plant any trees unless the Board grants permission upon written request submitted to the Board prior to any planting.
- 13. Gardening debris is to be bagged and placed next to the green trash cans.

Your gardening efforts in the front and/or rear areas of your unit, or the carport, that enhance the appearance of Mission Hills grounds is much appreciated. *






