FINANCIAL REPORT

hanks to John, our maintenance team, and the contractors, our pool reopened on Saturday, August 14, 2021, three weeks and two days weeks earlier than anticipated.

Concerns were presented at the last Board meeting about carport roofs and trees. We can only take care of these items as money is available, and then they are prioritized according to the most damaged carport or worst condition of a tree. So please be patient if your carport roof needs to be replaced or you have a tree that needs to be removed. THANK YOU! Our finances continue to be stable. Our July income was \$220,548 and expenses were \$238,375, so we were over budget in July by \$17,827. This was largely due to underground electrical problems, which involved removing trees and replacing electrical wiring. Also, building supplies have increased dramatically, so repairs cost more. As of July 31, 2021 we are under budget by \$69,372. This is due to prepaid condo fees and assessments. The balance on the 2021 assessment is now \$2,221.

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

ission Hills is very fortunate to have an active Neighborhood Watch group in its community. However, over the past few months, we have been receiving phone calls asking for assistance with issues that we do not have any jurisdiction over. So, to help everyone out, I just wanted to review exactly what Neighborhood Watch is.

The Neighborhood Watch program is a national program and it consists of a group of people living in the same area who want to make their neighborhood safer by working together and in conjunction with local law enforcement to reduce crime and improve the quality of life in their neighborhood. Here in Mission Hills, there is a group of residents who patrol the neighborhood each evening on a rotating basis. We each have a flashing light on our car roof, so you know who we are. On our patrol, we look for anything suspicious, illegally parked cars, and any lights that may be out in the carports.

The national program does NOT advocate watch members taking any action while observing suspicious activity in Mission Hills. We are only extra eyes and ears, and we report anything we observe to the police. We also NEVER try to take action on our observations. If there are things that we notice are happening on a regular basis, they are reported to the Board of Directors. They assess the situation and decide what action needs to be taken.



If you, as a resident, see anything suspicious, please call our local police. If it is an emergency situation, dial 911. If it is a situation that does not need immediate action, you may call 727-562-4242 and they will assist you. Do NOT call Neighborhood Watch members about stolen items, break-ins or help with a specific situation. Call the police instead. We are not authorized to assist in any of those situations.

I hope that this explanation helps you understand what our Neighborhood Watch group does. We always welcome new members, and you can call me if you wish to volunteer one to two hours a month to help us patrol the neighborhood at night.

You can also help us by keeping your front lights on all night. It makes such a difference!! Dusk to dawn lights are available for \$5, and you may call me to request one.

Thank you for helping to make Mission Hills the safe and wonderful community that it is.



BRUNCH HAM ENCHILADAS

INGREDIENTS:

- 2 cups Fully Cooked Ham, cubed
- 1/2 cup Green Onions, chopped
- 10 8" Flour Tortillas
- 2 cups Shredded Cheddar Cheese, divided
- 1 tbsp. All-Purpose Flour
- 2 cups Half-and-Half
- 6 large Eggs, lightly beaten

1/4 tsp. Salt, optional



INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. In a large bowl, combine ham and onions; place about ¼ cup down the center of each tortilla. Top with 2 tbsp. cheese. Roll up and place seam side down in a greased 13x9-in. baking dish.
- 2. In another large bowl, combine the flour, half-and-half, eggs and, if desired, salt until smooth. Pour over tortillas. Cover and refrigerate for 8 hours or overnight.
- 3. Remove from the refrigerator 30 minutes before baking. Cover and bake at 350° for 25 minutes. Uncover; bake for 10 minutes. Sprinkle with remaining cheese; bake 3 minutes longer or until the cheese is melted. Let stand for 10 minutes before serving.

How I Grew a Pineapple

From time to time, our Mission Hills Documents must be reviewed to ensure that they are accurate and in line with Florida Statute 718.

Input from our Mission Hills residents is always welcome. However, please be aware of the Board of Directors approved process below when requesting any changes/updates for possible proposed amendments.


Because this is a long and involved process, residents are invited to view the journey of an amendment, which is located in the Documents Committee manuals in our Mission Hills office. Reminder: These manuals can be copied at the residents' expense but cannot be removed from the building. The resident must make arrangements for printing or have the option to take their own notes while in the Clubhouse.

Here is the process that must be followed:

- 1. All requests must be submitted in writing.
- 2. The resident making the request must sign all submissions. If there is no signature, the request (s) are automatically denied.
- 3. All requests must contain accurate contact information, so the Documents Committee can reach out in the event there are any questions. If there is no contact information, the request(s) are automatically denied.
- 4. The request(s) must pertain to our Mission Hills Documents, Florida Statute 718, and our Policy and Procedures *only*.
- 5. You can e-mail your request(s) to: vetnerz2@gmail.com
- 6. The Mission Hills Documents Committee reviews all requests and provides updates to the requester.




