### **Mission Hills Diamond in the Rough**

Greetings, Mission Hills!

Blessed...Grateful...Overwhelmed...Thankful... Happy...Shocked...Fortunate...Humbled...these are just a few of the words that express the aftermath of Hurricane Ian.

Mission Hills and our surrounding area were spared the worst of the hurricanes destruction. And like all Floridians we continue to send our thoughts and prayers to everyone who suffered the devastating wrath of the storm. In our community, the hurricane cost us street signs, street lights, fire extinguisher covers, shingles, broken shuffleboard stations and 7 large trees. We picked up over 40,000 pounds of sticks and limbs. It has taken us about three weeks to clean up.

I'm proud to say our preparations were second to none. One example: half of our community was without power for up to  $3\frac{1}{2}$  days. During that time, we had a sewer back up. Because of our preventive measures, we were able to plug into a generator and save these residents some added challenges. We also spent Wednesday battening down the hatches and collecting all the garbage and recyclables. Then Ian hit! We were ready to go back on the job Thursday morning. Our contractors were notified and waiting with us to start the cleanup. The huge tree that fell across Mission Dr. E was cut up, pushed to the side, and gone by Friday. We were very fortunate not to experience the heat and humidity we suffered after Hurricane Irma.

Thank you very much to the residents of Mission Hills for your continued support of your maintenance team during these trying times. A timely reminder to everyone: if you are going on vacation or will be away for any length of time, make sure your plants, pots, furniture etc., are taken inside. Hurricane season ends November 30th.

SAFETY: Whenever there is suspicious activity going on in our community, take it upon yourselves to get the Clearwater police involved. The more residents that call the better. There are several numbers that you can use. It's important to work together to keep ourselves and our neighbors safe.

We have trimmed 500 plus palm trees so far during this fall season.

We are addressing sidewalks due to our tree root problems.

I would also like to thank the community for their continued patience on our sewer back ups. We have been addressing them and are working diligently on solutions. Please remember not to throw wipes down the toilet; they end up in the sewer system. Your neighbors will appreciate that. The wipes cause plumbing problems with your down line residents by blowing the seals out of the toilets and spilling water on the floor, along with sewage backup.

I am told as we move forward, roofs will be put on a two-year waiting list due to what has happened south of us. We had a material shortage before Hurricane Ian. One can only imagine moving forward the wait times, labor skill levels, and costs coming our way. \*

### **PULL-APART HAM & CHEESE SLIDERS**

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 1 pkg. Hawaiian Sweet Rolls, sheet of 12 rolls left intact (not pulled apart)
- 8 slices Deli Ham
- 4 slices Swiss Cheese
- 9 Pickle Slices (optional)
- $\frac{1}{4}$  cup ( $\frac{1}{2}$  stick) Unsalted Butter, melted
- 1 tbsp. Dijon Mustard

### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

- 1.Preheat the oven to 350° F.
- 2.Remove 3 buns on one end and cut the remaining 3x3 sheet of sweet rolls in half lengthwise.
- 3.Arrange the bottom half into a square baking pan; layer evenly with ham slices, then Swiss cheese, then pickles (optional). Cover with the top half of the sweet rolls.
- 4.In a small bowl, combine the melted butter and mustard, stirring until evenly mixed.
- 5. Pour the butter mixture all over the top of the sandwiches.
- 6.Bake for 20 minutes until the sweet rolls are golden brown and cheese is melted. Cut into individual sandwiches.

# Law of the Land

#### MISSION HILLS CONDOMINIUM ASSOCIATION HURRICAN SHUTTER POLICY STATEMENT

To ensure uniformity in the appearance of Mission Hills Condominium units, the Board of Directors has established this policy for hurricane shutters in accordance with Florida State Statue 718.113, section 5.

If an owner desires to install hurricane shutters on his/her unit, the installation may be done on the outside or the inside of the unit.

If on the outside, the owner must first contact the Mission Hills office. Any owner(s) interested in installing exterior hurricane shutters must obtain descriptions and specifications of shutters that are suitable for use on their specific units.

The purchase, upkeep, and maintenance of hurricane shutters shall be the responsibility of the owner(s) of the units on which they are installed








