At this point, our most important goal is to have the proposed amendments (newer and the ones from 2019) reviewed and voted on by our residents. Due to a large amount of confusion, we still have these outstanding proposed amendments that have been approved

by our BOD and attorney. This currently forces our Mission Hills documents to be out of compliance with the 718 laws.

Our thought is to hold seminars to discuss the purpose of our proxy and to help define the meanings of the proposed amendments. We are in the infant stages of planning these seminars, so keep your eyes pealed for more details.

Your Documents Committee is very knowledgeable since that's all we've concentrated on for the past six years. Here's what's going on in Mission Hills from the perspective of the Maintenance Department:

- Happy belated Birthday to Jason, who celebrated his birthday in August.
- Reminder: The 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesday of every month between 9 AM and 12 PM is the large garbage drop off at the Clubhouse.
- Landscaping throughout the community is being addressed.
- We cut grass on Monday and Tuesday. When parking your vehicles, please stay off the grass. If you park your vehicle in the shuffleboard area, please give the mowers and landscapers room to cut the grass.
- Please put yard clippings inside a bag and place by garbage cans. We don't want any little friends waiting for us when we go to pick up the clippings.
- SAFETY ALERT...Be aware of your surroundings. We had a car broken into and parts stolen from a
  motorcycle near the wall.
- I would like to thank the residents of Phase 3 for their patience with the hot water line breaks, and also Phase 9 with water challenges.
- I would also like to thank the community for their continued patience on our sewer back ups. We have been
  addressing them and are working diligently on solutions. Please remember not to throw wipes down the toilet
  into the sewer system. Your neighbors will appreciate that. The wipes cause plumbing problems with your
  down line residents by blowing the seals out of the toilets and spilling water on the floor along with backup
  sewage.
- We have had a number of residents install a "bidet sprayer" to there toilets. It's inexpensive and does the trick.
- I would like to share some of the modern day challenges regarding roofing contractors:
  - In the last 24 months, there has been 22 months in a row of price increases.
  - Metal is now three times what it was.
  - Fasteners for flat roofs are out of stock until next year.
  - In all contractor agreements, there is an escalator clause that is now being activated like never before.
  - This does not even touch on the skill set of labor or getting labor.
  - We've had seven roofers and one landscaper suffer from heat stroke. Thankfully all have recovered.

As you can see, materials and wait times are higher and longer. I can't stress enough how fortunate we are to have had all the roofs done, which is over two-thirds of the community, when many other places are struggling with no end in site.

Our roofs are all completed for this year. I would like to thank the residents for their patience and understanding in these uncertain times.







For several years, Mission Hills residents had been concerned about some By-Law violations with "nothing being done about it."

In June 2019, Mission Hills established the very first Compliance Committee to help address these issues. Since its inception, there have been over 20 compliance issues that have been resolved without the resident having to appear before the committee...and that's a great thing!

Many, especially our newer residents, might not be aware of the initial steps required to report a By-Laws or Statute 718 violation. It is quite simple, so here we go. *With as much detail as possible, you must send an e-mail to our Property Manager, Jim Mateka. His contact information is always on page 2 of every edition of the Mission Hills Post. In the subject line of your message, you must write, "MH COMPLIANCE."* 

This is where your participation ends. Remember...your message is strictly confidential. The ONLY people who would know who the sender is will be that person and our Property Manager.

#### DO NOT CONTACT THE OFFICE, ANY BOARD MEMBER, OR MAINTENANCE!

#### So what, then, is the role of the Compliance Committee?

Chapter 718 Florida Statutes (718.303(3)(b), dated July, 2018, states, in part that, "A fine or suspension levied by the board of administration may not be imposed unless the board first provides at least 14 days' written notice to the unit owner and, if applicable, any occupant, licensee, or invitee of the unit owner sought to be fined or suspended, and an opportunity for a hearing before a committee of at least three members appointed by the board who are not officers, directors, or employees of the association, or the spouse, parent, child, brother, or sister of an officer, or employee. The role of the committee is limited to determining whether to confirm or reject the fine or suspension levied by the board. If the committee does not approve the proposed fine or suspension by majority vote, the fine or suspension may not be imposed."

\_\_\_\_\_

The preceding paragraphs are key to understanding the role of a Compliance Committee. The Committee does not search the community for violations, report violations to the Board, nor determine what a fine will be.

What the committee does do, if requested by the resident(s) is meet with him, her, or them and review the situation, and make a recommendation as to whether the fine proposed by the Bboard is fair and reasonable.

## **BUFFALO CRACK CHICKEN DIP**

#### INGREDIENTS:

3 cups Rotisserie Chicken, shredded, or about 1 lb. Chicken Breasts. cooked and shredded 1 8-oz. pkg. Cream Cheese 2 cups Mozzarella Cheese Ranch Seasoning Mix 1 cup Cheddar Cheese 1 cup Mayo and Sour Cream ½ cup Green Onions, chopped ½ cup Buffalo Sauce 1 tsp. Garlic, minced ½ lb. Bacon, cooked and chopped



#### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

- 1. Lightly spray with cooking spray a 2 qt baking dish, set aside.
- 2. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- 3. Combine all ingredients starting with the shredded, cooked chicken up to the minced garlic. Stir well to combine.
- 4. Transfer to the prepared baking dish and top with the cooked chopped bacon.
- 5. Bake in the preheated oven for 25-30 minutes, until hot and bubbly.
- 6. Serve immediately with crackers or toasted cocktail bread.

#### Can I make Buffalo Crack Chicken Dip in advance?

Yes, it is very easy to prepare ahead and then bake before your guests arrive. The dip takes about 15 minutes to assemble, so it is very convenient. For best results, we recommend preparing the dip one day in advance and store in the refrigerator before baking. When ready to serve, put the prepared dip in the oven at 350 degrees and cook for about 25-30 minutes.






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
