# Treasurer's Report

Our delinquencies are \$10,399.20 for September. Revenues are \$232,786.45. Expenses are \$238,089.48. We are over for the month by \$5,303.03 and over year to date by \$60,352.05. The Operating expense (non-reserves) are under budget by \$10,597.62. The pre-approval process for purchases is helping to reduce the costs.

We are over budget on water by \$12K+, electric by \$5K, cable to \$7.8K. Sewer by \$9K. If everyone can conserve on utilities through the end of the year and we don't have any major unexpected expenses, we can hopefully avoid a special assessment. We have money in a 2019 Special Assessment account left over from the roof loan. The loan is paid off and we moved the balance of \$28,972.98 to deferred maintenance to help with needed repairs.

The budget meeting is November 21<sup>st</sup>. We had a budget workshop and came up with a preliminary budget. The budget will be finalized at the November meeting. The current budget includes increases of \$120-\$150 per month based on unit size. This assumes our insurance will double. If it is less, the budget will be less. We will have a better estimate by the November meeting. Insurance and reserves are not included in the 15% cap and we are still under that. Final adjustments will be made at the meeting.

I know this is a big increase but we do get a lot of value for our money. This includes many amenities that other COA's don't always get (gas, hot water. Trash, clubhouse, pool, landscaping, cable TV/internet and many great Booster Club activities). Unfortunately, we have no control over what the insurance industry is doing.

Some have asked if we can have a special assessment instead of a monthly increase. I have discussed this with Jen and Karen at Ameritech and they agree with me on my position. 1) Special assessments are supposed to be for "special" extraordinary work that needs to be done 2) We have seen, based on the increase in delinquencies, that people will pay their monthly maintenance fees before they'll pay the special assessment fees 3) Special assessments are not and cannot be included as part of the budget so we would report being over budget every month 4) We would continue to need a special assessment every year to cover these costs even if they don't increase more 5) People buying in Mission Hills have the right to know the true costs that we need to cover. Hiding them in a special assessment isn't right.

# From the Secretary's desk:

As we started our campaign process during this time last year, one of our goals was to bring Unity to the Community.

Navigating through the originally elected board challenges, Al and I worked very hard to keep that spirit alive.

When we lost 3 of our board members on the same day, Al and I solicited help from the "Resource Team" to join the board. This group was a group of residents who always shared the campaign's vision, and they still are—knowledgeable professionals who unselfishly were willing to take on the responsibility and stepped up to the challenge.

In the middle of all this, we were blessed with Jone, someone with 8 years of board Treasurer experience who also volunteered to work with this new board. We could not have been luckier. Oddly enough, I see in her someone who could very well share the vision we set out originally when we were campaigning.

When we built the board back up in May with all our new members, I chose to remain as a secretary and received support as such from the rest of the board. That never supersedes my responsibility first, as a board member, and second, performing my collateral responsibilities as a secretary.

In going down the list of campaign promises I noticed one thing I could say we did differently and that is the quarterly Town Hall meetings. However, by implementing the Board Blast email, a Communications Team, and a mailbox in the lobby of the clubhouse we are able to receive your questions on a more frequent basis and make the process more fluid instead of waiting to get answers from the board once every 3 months.

When you send an email through the blast or place your questions in the lobby's mailbox, two things happen: 1) you receive your answer right away and 2) you are given the opportunity to the board to share the question and the answer during the "Teams" section of the board meeting; and as per a resident's request, we will share the question with you on the board blast as were receive them Please make sure your name and phone number are included so we may answer you personally.

# Safety, Safety, Safety.

Mission Hills has over 150 fire extinguishers on the property and the operability know-how is as important as having them available for residents to use in an emergency.

Al, our board's VP, organized all the maintenance crew in collaboration with the Fire Extinguishing company in order to undergo fire extinguishing operation training. This training was delivered in-house on October 17.

This is a very important and key tool for everyone to use in case of an emergency. But, we are not limiting it to just our crew since they are not available after 4:30 PM or on weekends.

#### From the Communications Team:

Cameras were a subject that came up during the last board meeting, in an effort to answer some of your questions, please read below the final outcome.

The Booster Club had purchased the cameras for the Mission Hills Association a few years ago. We, as a new board, tried to understand its functionality. Unfortunately, we kept going back and forth looking for manuals, passwords, applications, and all sorts of things which created a lot of confusion and anxiety among a few.

Monday morning, the problem was solved. Vicky Loper, the President of the Booster Club, met up with the Ameri-tech IT department, members of the board, Bob Kelly, the Property Manager, and the IT tech of the security company and we finally all came to an agreement that the Ameri-tech IT department would hold the security monitoring in addition to the system in the office.

The board has access to the system in the office and Ameri-tech has a 24 hr IT department if need be.

Vicky affirmed the ownership of the cameras was for Mission Hills security purposes. She showed support in relinquishing control of the security system to the Property Management Company.

We were all in agreement and we hope you are too.

In addition, the swimming pool and the living room temperature were adjusted as per your requests.

Recycled Sneakers by Susan Salesses





# **NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH by Susan Salesses, Coordinator**


Happy fall! Just two reminders this month -

# Mission Hills Monthly Maintenance Report

There are a number of issues that we are dealing with on a monthly basis. My involvement is simply volunteering my time daily to improve the proficiency of the maintenance crew, which in turn will hopefully result in a number of savings, one of which is to avoid another \$615,963.00 Special Assessment in the future. That was my main goal when accepting to join the ranks of the Board of Directors when I was asked. Collectively, we work daily for the betterment of the community's bottom line.

#### Roofs:

The roof maintenance and carport replacements continue. There are 3 types of roofs here at Mission Hills: T.P.O., Modified System, and Built-up roofs. The existing carport roofs have built-up roofs. For some reason, it was changed to TPO which is more expensive, fragile, and unable to be repaired by our crew because of the proprietary properties of the material used. TPO roofs are rarely used on a one-story building as they are not conducive to branches falling on them.

We are in the process of replacing 4 carport roofs before the end of the year by a qualified, 30-year roofer with all the credentials necessary to do the work in protecting the liability of Mission Hills.

There are also ongoing repairs to the main roofs. Some of the newer roofs are TPO as well and they are unable to be repaired by our crew. Some of the roofs being repaired are either installed this year or last. No reason to have leaks but they do, and when the roofing company determines "is not their fault", in the past, we went ahead and paid what they asked without shopping around. This year alone, we spent \$10,000 on Small Roof Repairs when some of them could have been done by our crew. That practice is no longer an option.

# Electrical and gas lines:

Electrical: We have been working to replace the main feeder electrical lines (direct burial), at phase 5. We just received the quote from Alston Electric for 24,168.43. It is been a long process just getting quotes. We hope to have this work started shortly.

Gas: There are existing gas lines running along the roofs, feeding the A/C gas lines for the A/C package roof units. We have gas heating systems and as the practice of precaution and safety, owners should have the A.C. systems checked at least once a year, to ensure the A.C. unit is running at its peak performance. Please make sure they are aware of the gas lines, and that they do not damage any of the gas supply lines. They also must check in at the office, the subforms are in the lobby.

After Scotto's Plumbing Company free water heaters report, they detected several gas leaks. We then uncovered excessive gas bills coming from water heater and AC leaks. The water heater leaks are being addressed at this time. Our crew is uncovering A/C leaks and homeowners will get a notice to address this issue with their A/C provider.

### Landscaping:

Trees: You may have heard the buzzing of saws, removing selected trees by the arborist's recommendation. They are also trimming a few trees along the way. This is an ongoing project.

#### General:

Over the past 2 months, we have been evaluating the Maintenance Operation. As you already know, the crew is extremely talented and hard-working, they work as a team, with no ranking generals, or ranking privates, they just do whatever is asked of them on a daily basis. They truly care about Mission Hills and all of the residents in it. I'm honored to work with them.

The primary purpose of the Email Blast is to keep our Mission Hills folks informed about the really fun and various activities that are held here.



# Lasagna Roll-Ups

Level: Easy

Total: 1 hr 40 min

Prep: 40 min

Cook 1 hr

Yield 10 to 12 servings

# Ingredients:

20 lasagna noodles

Kosher salt

2 tablespoons olive oil

1 cup chopped mushrooms

1 green pepper diced

3 cloves minced garlic

2 pounds ground beef

Freshly ground pepper

1 28 ounce can diced tomatoes

1 6 ounce can tomato paste

4 tablespoons minced fresh parsley

1 30 ounce whole milk ricotta cheese

1 pound mozzarella, grated

1 cup grated parmesan cheese

2 large eggs



#### Directions:

- 1. Cook the lasagna noodles in salted water until al dente. Drain, rinse with cold water to cool and lay flat on a sheet of foil.
- 2. Make sauce. Heat the olive oil. Add onion, mushrooms, green pepper and garlic, saute 4 to 5 minutes. Remove the veggies, then add ground beef and cook until browned. Drain fat and add 1/2 teaspoon salt and pepper, diced tomatoes, tomato paste, the veggie mixture and 1 tablespoon parsley and basil. Simmer on low heat 30 minutes.
- 3. Filling: combine ricotta, 1/2 cup mozzarella, 3/4 cup parmesan, the eggs, 1/2 tsp salt and pepper. Combine. Take it up a notch with a little ground nutmeg and lemon rind.
- 4. Assemble: Spoon a thin layer of sauce onto the bottom of a 9x13 pan. Spread 2-3 tablespoons ricotta filling on each lasagna noodle, then roll them up so that the cheese is on the inside of the roll. Lay them sideways in the pan. Top with remaing sauce and plenty of grated mozzarella and parmesan.
- 5. Bake at 375 degrees F for 20 minutes, until hot and bubbly.
- 6. Eat and or freeze the remaining for up to 4 months.. Reheat at 350 F for 1 1/2 hours with foil covered and remove the foil and bake 30 minutes more.
