Instead, they will be groups of three to five concerned individuals who will become informed and work together to assist the board in financial decision-making. There should not be a controlling leader. Instead, each member will take turns in leading their group – as they make conclusions and suggestions to the board.

This is a must! To meet future challenges we simply must have concerned owners who will work together and serve, not only themselves but their neighbors. Please consider your involvement and step up. If we do this – our Mission Hills family will secure a healthy future!

# **Treasurer's Report**

#### TREASURER'S REPORT

Happy New Year everyone! Hope your holidays were merry. December was a busy month with 2 budget meetings and a board meeting. Our November revenue was \$235,851. Our November expenses were \$246,055. Month to date, we are over budget by \$10,202.10. Year to date, we are over budget by \$86,334.13. Our November delinquencies are \$10,549. \$1,576 of that is from the 2022/2023 special assessment.

The budget was approved on December 12<sup>th</sup> after we received the final insurance costs from Bob Mitchell. Bob did a great job shopping the marketplace and got many bids. We are keeping our current insurance company, American Coastal. The rate went up 30%. The new base number is \$491,349. In addition to that we have finance charges of \$21.6K(we have to finance it), \$1.5K for document stamps and \$3K for a valuation study next July that is required by statute. The other change we made was to increase the Operating Contingency from \$50K to \$100K instead of having a special assessment.

Here are the increases for 2024:

We will continue to understand and manage costs closely in the coming year.

Remember that a member of the team might call you to acknowledge its receipt but it will be answered by a board member. 2) email your questions directly to the board; either the board blast or board members individually.

From time to time, we print a sheet with all your Q&A and share the information with the rest of the residents. Someone sent an email suggesting that, and we are doing it.

To minimize emails and avoid email fatigue, we accumulate a few questions before we send it out.

We have emailed a previous Q&A and we will email another one in the next few days. It will also be posted on the bulletin board for your viewing.

Questions you send to the board, are taken up during the board meeting which opens the door to ask follow-up questions after the meeting is adjourned, time permitting.

We offer many ways of distributing the Q&A: bulletin board posting, BOD meeting minutes, Newsletter, and email. It is really confusing when I hear someone say "didn't know" or that there is no "transparency." If you want to know something, you just have to either read or ask. You will get your question answered.

# eams updates and more:

he subject that keeps continuously resurfacing is the sale of the boom truck. There are prerequisites to be ble to justify the purchase of another truck. The components will be training, licensing, workmen's compenation, and of course, funds available. Training: they attended training from Arborist Apollo at the beginning f the year, attended the Arborist John Snow presentation, and will attend the next Arborist Apollo presentation in January. Licensing: they already have Landscape Best Practices certification, and Jason and Mark 1st became certified in Fertilizer/Pesticide best practices which is very important to know when to fertilize nd how, etc. Some of you have seen a boom truck on the property being used by the crew to trim palm rees in the boulevard, they already have received trimming training for Palm trees. And, the last piece of the uzzle is worker's compensation: we came to an agreement with Ameritech and they agreed to cover the ervice crew whether the truck is ours or rented. We have to add again, that the sale of the truck helped reuce the over-budget amount for 2023. One more of the components that have been done to avoid special ssessments at this time.

The First program will be fire extinguisher training session delivered by one four own Clearwater finest, Clearwater Fire Department and a Clearwater native Ryan Cotton. This approxnately half-hour session will be offered to all residents of our community on Monday 8th, 2024 in the naintenance area at 10:00 am. A signup sheet will be in front of the office or you may send us an email.

Iso, Terry Toner will be contacted regarding programs available to our community, and the Clearwater Fire Department to set up a CPR session. I am looking for residents of our community who have any ideas that vill help benefit us all here in Mission Hills.

## **AMENDMENTS NEEDED TO BE VOTED ON IN 2024**

# Amendment #1: To allow motorcycles on the property

Motorcycles are permitted to be parked on the condominium property provided that they have a permit, and are parked in the owner's assigned carport parking spot in such a way as not to block or encroach with any neighboring vehicle, parking spots, or any sidewalk areas in front of the sheds, and do not create a nuisance. Motorcycles must respect the speed limit and stop signs, and drive into and out of the property in idle mode to minimize noise. Repeat violations of the posted speed limit, parking or stop signs by any vehicle owner may result in towing of the vehicle at the vehicle owner's expense and/or denial of future access to the condominium property.

# Amendment #2: Staggered terms for Board of Directors

All Directors shall be elected for a term of two (2) years and terms of Directors shall be staggered to ensure continuity on the Board of Directors. Therefore, at the first election of the Board of Directors following the adoption of this amendment, three (3) of the Directors shall be elected for a two (2) year term, with the other two (2) elected Directors being elected for a one (1) year term. The top three (3) votegetters shall serve the initial two (2) year terms, and the other two (2) elected Directors shall serve the initial one (1) year term(s) (unless there is no election due to fewer than/the same number of candidates as vacancies, in which case the Board of Directors will determine which Directors serve which terms). Following this first election, the terms of all Directors shall be for two (2) years.

# Mission Hills Monthly Maintenance Report

# Maintenance Report

Roofs: The maintenance crew has been working on the repairs of drywall, caused by roofs leaking. The most recent roof leak was caused by a varmint chewing a hole in a T.P.O. roof system. This type of roof is a plastic-based, heat-seamed system, and the varmints have no problem chewing through it. We are using a bait treatment to counter the problem. For the new roofs in the future, we will be going back to using an asphalt-based modified type. The varmints do not like the asphalt base if they try and chew through it. We have several roofs of that type currently. We need your help in mandating the vendors that work on the air condition units and get on the

We need your help in mandating the vendors that work on the air condition units and get on the roof to make sure they sign in at the office. We still find unauthorized vendors working on the roof. Part of the leaks we have on roofs are due to vendors walking on them. A letter of non-compliance will be mailed to vendors not reporting in the office and residents might be responsible. Please, help the community on this issue since is costing Mission Hills a lot of money on unnecessary repairs.

Home owner's condo insurance: In the event, any damage occurs, from a roof leaking or any other type of damage not covered by the association. The condo association is responsible for drywall repairs only. We recommend you take out a homeowner's condo policy to cover all other repairs necessary not covered by the condo association, i.e., cabinets, appliances, interior decor, etc. Call Sue at the office for more details.






#### BELL RINGERS FOR SALVATION ARMY
