#### FINANCE REPORT—JOE BOOTH

Reporting for the year ending period 12-31-19 we end out year over budget by \$63,000 mainly due to expenses that were not anticipated. The annual budget is largely a guesstimate of what to expect during the year based on the income you expect. All in all it was a good budget.

We need to thank the efforts of the Finance Committee and Ameritech for their overview and input last year.

Going forward we still have money in reserves for the roofs project and will probably be looking at another assessment in 2020 to get this monkey off our back. Also, we will have reserves for carport replacement available. We did a lot with the monies we had.

Keep in mind that having our own" in house" maintenance department is a big cost savings rather than having to contract out and have outside services do all the work our skilled team performs. DON'T LET ANYONE TELL YOU DIFFERENTLY. We have been down that road before. We do not complain about the cost of that line item.

The financial management of Mission Hills is a day to day project. You must have a Board that will work with the accounting team at Ameritech. So much goes into it. Especially making practical fair decisions on a day to day basis. Sue Huntley has been an asset in addressing our bills and the coding that assigns the bills to the appropriate cost lines. It's got to be a team effort.

As long as you have a Board that understands you have a business to run and it has to be addressed on a day to day basis. You cannot manage this community when you are not here.

2020 will hold its own challenges. We hope that our assets and community are protected and will be managed in a practical manner. Compared to many other condo communities we are in good shape. Let's get a Board that will keep it that way.

written in the Florida State Statute 718 were clearly outlined. Since you are now armed with that information, this would be a perfect time for you to become a part of something very positive for Mission Hills.

All interested residents are requested to write their name and phone number on a slip of paper, place it in a sealed envelope and label it "Compliance", ATTN: Kay Hunt. Drop it in the office mail slot and you will be notified of an interview date and time.

> Remember: you are not required to be a full-time resident. You must, however, be an owner.

> > You have the laws .. now let's form the order!

#### COMPLIANCE COMMITTEE AND HOW IT FUNCTIONS

Our Management Company, Ameri-tech, tours our community and notes violations of our By-Laws, the Declaration, or the Florida State Statute 718. The results of this initial survey are given directly to the Mission Hills Board of Directors.

#### So what, then, is the role of the Compliance Committee?

Chapter 718 Florida Statutes (718.305(3)(b), dated July, 2018, states, in part that "A fine or suspension levied by the board of administration may not be imposed unless the board first provides at least 14 days' written notice to the unit owner and, if applicable, any occupant, licensee, or invitee of the unit owner sought to be fined or suspended, and an apportunity for a hearing before a committee of at least three members appointed by the board who are not officers, directors, or employees of the association, or the spouse, parent, child, brother, or sister of an officer, or employee. The role of the committee is limited to determining whether to confirm or reject the fine or suspension levied by the board. If the committee does not approve the proposed fine or suspension by majority vote, the fine or suspension may not be imposed."

The preceding paragraphs are key to understanding the role of a Compliance Committee. The committee does not search the community for violations, report violations to the board, nor determine what a fine will be. What the committee does do, if requested by the resident(s) is to meet with him, her or them and review the situation and decide whether the fine proposed by the board is fair and reasonable.

#### Ingredients

1 refrigerated pie crust

6 large eggs

3/4 cup milk or pream-

3/4 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon black pepper

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F.

Unroll pie crust and press into a 9" pie plate, crimping the top edges if desired.

In a large bowl, whisk together eggs, milk, salt and pepper.

Sprinkle ham, 1 cup of cheese, and green onions into the pie crust and pour the egg mixture over top. Sprinkle remaining 1/2 cup cheese on top of egg mixture.

Bake for 35-40 minutes until the center is completely set. Let cool for 5-10 minutes before slicing and serving.
