# DOG POLICY

Mission Hills is a "no pet" community. However, when certain criteria are met, a resident may be granted permission to keep an animal. With that privilege comes responsibilities, so all neighbors can continue safe and quiet enjoyment of their homes. Following are the rules owners must follow to keep their dog in our community.

- The owner must inform the Mission Hills office of ownership of a dog at the time of application for residency, provide Service Animal and medical need documentation, the dog's registration form and a photograph.
- The owner must provide the animal's current license, inoculation/vaccination records from a veterinarian, and continue to keep such records current for the entire occupancy in Mission Hills.
- 3. The dog must always be leashed and under the owner's control at all times when outside the owner's home, and not staked and left in the common area.
- 4. The owner will immediately pick up and properly dispose of the dog's waste.
- The dog will be walked in areas that are away from the immediate vicinity of all residents.
- 6. Excessive barking will not be tolerated.
- Any signs of aggressive traits may be cause for muzzling the dog or having it removed from the community property.
- The owner and dog are governed by these rules, as well as the laws of Pinellas County and City of Clearwater Animal Control.
- 9. Common sense and courtesy should always be applied.
- Guests and relatives are prohibited from bringing any animals onto Mission Hills property.

The privilege of having a dog may be revoked at any time the dog becomes a nuisance or displays aggressive behavior to other residents, or if the above policy is violated in any way.

The pool opened this month with specific guidelines that conform with Pinellas County Current Order.



The vase was very tall, maybe about 24 inches. Some of its sides were a silver color, with open sides that were filled in with clear acrylic.



# FRENCH ONION STUFFED POTATOES

Serves 4 ★ 10 Minutes Prep ★ 30 Minutes Cook Time

# **INGREDIENTS**

4 large Potatoes, baked

4 tbsp. Butter

4 Onions, halved and thinly sliced

½ tsp. Dried Thyme

½ cup Sherry or Dry White Wine

1 cup Beef Stock

2 cups Gruyere Cheese, grated

Kosher Salt and Freshly Ground Black Pepper to taste



# **PREPARATION**


- 1. Preheat oven to 375°F.
- In a large skillet over medium-high heat, melt butter. Add onions and season with salt, pepper and thyme. Cook slowly until very soft and caramel colored, stirring occasionally.
- 3. Deglaze pan with sherry or wine, then add stock and bring to a low boil. Let cook until liquid is nearly gone, 5-10 minutes.
- 4. Meanwhile, cut the top third off each potato lengthwise and scoop the flesh into a medium bowl. Add half of the onion mixture to the potato flesh and stir to combine.
- 5. Refill each potato shell and place on a baking sheet. Top with remaining onions and Gruyere cheese.
- 6. Bake until cheese has melted. For more color, broil on high for 1 minute. Enjoy!

Hope that all you stuffed potato lovers enjoy this...it's DELISH!!!!


