If you knew her, you either loved her or hated her and you knew where you stood with her. That describes my mother, Vicki Buchheit, to a "T." I loved her dearly, though there were many times when she had no qualms about telling me what I did wrong. As a wise man once told me, it is always good to know where you stand. Only then can you be responsible for what is so.

Vicki loved Mission Hills and dedicated herself to ensuring its financial and physical well-being. She moved to MH during the fall of 1998 and quickly became involved with the owners association. At that time, she brought with her about 20 years of experience in real estate management, finance and accounting.

I knew of her many health challenges. They started in the late 1960's with lower back problems caused by pregnancy and delivery of yours truly. She celebrated her 30th birthday in the hospital recovering from back surgery. Her doctor recommended avoiding another pregnancy over concerns that the physical strain would aggravate the back condition. Explains why I am an only child.

Her back issues returned a few years after she moved to MH and she underwent surgery again during 2005. I came down to assist her during recovery. Most of her lower spine was wrapped, screwed or fused together. Spinal degeneration continued, spreading to her neck. I have no idea how she endured the constant pain. She was too stubborn to let that slow her down.

What got her in the end was cancer that spread to several areas. Of course, she never said a word about this to me, or really anyone, except a close friend and confidant. She didn't want me to "worry." When we visited during July 2019, I could tell she was not doing well. Her appetite was gone and ice packs were her best friend. We talked right before Thanksgiving and she told me, "I can't fight anymore." That was the first and last time I heard those words come out of her mouth.

I am sharing all this not for sympathy, but rather to share that Vicki was a fighter. She "distracted" herself from her health issues by contributing to others. One can always contribute in some way. I appreciated that about her and it rubbed off on me. I serve on our neighborhood association board and write our newsletter.

Thank you to all of Vicki's friends who sent cards and notes. I read all of them to her and lined her room with them, so all of you were there with her. Please say "hello" to her when you walk by the new live oak tree on Mission Boulevard East. Maybe sit on the bench and have a chat. She would like that.

When mom passed last December, I realized the monumental task in front of me. With tremendous help from my wife, Jenn, and friends in Mission Hills, we got it done. In particular, I wish to thank Sue Huntley, Susan Salesses, Peter Salesses, Cathy Harris, Joe Czop, Rose Feneck, Mike Philbin, Angie Jimenez, Joe Booth, Stephanie Sadler and John Prokopovich for their support and assistance.

Again, my thanks, appreciation and love to all of the great folks in Mission Hills. We hope to visit sometime during 2021 with Vicki's grandchildren.




DOCUMENTS COMMITTEE - COME ONE, COME ALL!



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
