FINANCIAL REPORT

December finances are as follows:

Income

\$331,942

Expenses

\$401,087

Overbudget

(\$69,145)

YTD Overbudget

(\$22,763)

These figures include collection and transfer of assessment funds and the deposit for the 2023 insurance policies.

Explanation of insurance premium payments:

The board secretary presented a refund check for our insurance, which she received January 13, 2023 and chose not to give to Ameritech or notify the board until the January 18, 2023 Board meeting.

After reviewing the issue this is how this occurred.

Our accountant at Ameri-Tech, for whatever reason, did not receive a copy of the finance agreement showing we owed 10 payments. Therefore, regular monthly payments were made as shown on the 2022 Budget. Our February 2022 payment was late because Ameri-Tech did not receive an invoice from First Insurance on time. Our accountant asked that our payments be automatically withdrawn so this would not happen again, but for some reason First Insurance would not accommodate this request. If First Insurance had done this, the automatic withdrawal payments would have ceased in October.

Apparently First Insurance sent a refund check dated November 17, 2022, but it was never received. If we had received this check, or First Insurance had emailed Ameri-Tech, we would have known our insurance was paid in full and not sent the December payment. We now have the December check in hand and are waiting for a replacement of the November check. Since the check we received had no address on it, perhaps that is why we never got the November check. Why First Insurance gave a check for Mission Hills to Great Florida Insurance, who in turn gave it to our board secretary is not clear. Since Mission Hills/Ameri-Tech paid the finance premium to First Insurance, then the return checks should have gone to Mission Hills/Ameri-Tech. That is the proper way to conduct business.

We cannot correct 2022, but the blessing is that we will have \$44,719 to cover the shortfall of \$40,781 for our 2023 insurance premiums.

A primary responsibility of your Mission Hills Documents Committee is the continuing education of all of our residents as we plow through our By-Laws, Declaration, the Statute 718, and all the various other laws and rules which govern condo living in the state of Florida.

In order to assist with this mission, we have scheduled two Informational Seminars ... one on January 19, 2023 which was well received with our 2nd one scheduled for February 16, 2023 at 6PM.

Included in these Informational Seminars will be detailed discussions in regards to proxies. We will offer specific definitions about proxy, votes, and the like. We will also discuss the now 5 proposed amendments, 2 of which have been pending resident votes since 2019.

As of this moment, your Documents Committee is preparing packets of information that will be ready in time for the seminar. Included will be a "Frequently Asked Questions" sheet. As always, your Documents Committee will hold a Q&A after these discussions, so please feel free to write down what you want to ask us on the pages of your packets.

Your Documents Committee holds regular meetings on the 3rd Friday of every month at 11AM unless otherwise noted. We invite our residents to attend these meeting so that you might get an understanding of the challenges we face in the creation of proposed amendments to keep our documents in compliance with the State Statue 718. The Documents Committee just recently receive a nice compliment ... since our inception is 2017, we were advised that, due to our diligence, we have saved Mission Hills close to \$15K -- CHALLENGE ACCEPTED!!

Neighborhood Watch Reminders –



We hope that 2023 has gotten off to a great start for you and your families. This month we are going to offer a few more safety tips, thanks to Genesis Security.

Get to know your neighbors. As busy as life makes us, it is important to get to know your neighbors so you all can work together to make sure everyone is keeping an eye out for what is happening around your condo for everyone's safety.

Be aware of suspicious behavior. Notify the police at 727-562-4242 if you notice anything suspicious. If it is an emergency situation, dial 911.

Always lock up. It is important to lock your condos, cars and bikes. Also, when you go away, be sure to bring in items of value.

Use your peephole. Even if you are expecting someone over, it doesn't hurt to take a peek at who is at your door before opening it. If you don't have a peephole, it may be a good idea to have one installed for your safety.

Make sure lights are replaced. Members of the Neighborhood Watch Team look for carport and streetlights that are burned out. The outages are then reported. As a courtesy to your neighbors, it is very important that you leave your front porch lights on all night. People coming and going from the carports need you to have your light on for their safety. LED dusk to dawn lights (and adapters if you need one) are available for just \$5.00 and cost pennies a month to use. Most people don't even notice a difference in their electric bill. Lighting is a way to help in the prevention of crime and increase the safety in and around the condo areas.



LET'S TALK ABOUT SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS

A special assessment is required of all owners in a condominium association anytime an issue or project arises which is beyond the financial scope of the budget or reserves. When you bought into Mission Hills, you became a member and owner of the association. As a result, you are responsible and must share the costs of maintaining the common elements: roads, sewer system, water lines, physical plant, roofs, carports and exteriors of the buildings and equipment. The cost of any repairs must be shared by all 477 owners.

The Board of Directors has no control over an assessment. They should not be blamed when it's necessary to implement an assessment to cover repairs or replacement of the affected areas, or to seek bids, if and when necessary, as required by the statute. An example would be if an underground waterline was affected and had to be replaced, if/when we repave our roads, or an unforeseen, unplanned event not covered by the reserves or an annual budget. It is usually a singular event and a payment plan is usually put in place.

Since reserves were not set up when Mission Hills was started in 1971, it has presented a problem over the years as the community aged. Solid reserves were not put in place until 2007. As reserves were added, our monthly maintenance fees rose to where they are now. Assessments are one shot events and do not affect our monthly fees. Raising the reserves will raise our monthly condo fees.

Because we live in a land leased community, we basically pay the owners of the land a monthly rental that we all share in our condo fees. Right now, we each pay approximately \$85 a month for the land lease. As an example, if you own a 2/2, your monthly condo fee is \$558.43, less the \$85 land lease, you pay approximately \$473. That's not bad considering all you get for your money. Of course, all of this should have been explained to you by your realtor when you looked to buy in Mission Hills. This is all part of life and living in a land leased condominium association.

Bon Appetit—Super Bowl Crab Dip

8 ounce cream cheese at room temp

1/4 cup mayonnaise

1/4 cup sour cream

1 cup grated sharp cheddar cheese


STAMPWOUNED (<u>www.stampsforthewounded.org</u>)


