Presidents Satement

"What is NICE vs. what is NEEDED"

The world is rapidly changing with inflation, which goes beyond the monetary, affecting every aspect of our lives. We had better be in a place, as individuals, and as Florida communities, to embrace these challenges. Last month's President's Statement expressed four phases in our approach to doing just that: **Evaluation / Sorting / Aligning / Consistency**.

While <u>Evaluation</u> will always be continuous it is where we are at in this process as we uncover our present condition and move into <u>Sorting</u>. Sorting is where we determine how a process or thing adds value and if it was or is needed. If it is not <u>adding value</u>, it becomes an unnecessary expense and must go, e.g., the orange lift truck we sold yesterday. Several things were considered in selling it: The high-risk danger to inexperienced operators, the lack of liability insurance, the improper pruning to our trees that this lift truck enabled, and much more. The sale price was beyond the original purchase price and that badly needed money has been placed into "Operating Equity" which is still in the negative. Many thanks to cost-cutting team member, Kevin Acton, who negotiated the deal and got top dollar for us.

Maintenance labor is being looked at as far as proper utilization and efficiency. We cannot determine what is necessary to accomplish all the maintenance needs of Mission Hills properly until we have existing resources maximized. We are walking in the shoes of our workers by picking up garbage, recyclables, etc. with them. How else will we find a better process, unless we are working that job alongside them? None of us can be afraid of getting dirty if we want to see the big picture here. This involves maintenance leadership (management) providing effective workflow and direction. Then, and only then, can we begin to seek the remaining needed resources to accomplish the task and avoid neglect related to not staying ahead with maintenance upkeep.

TREES will be a big part of our discussion in the very near future. Our greatest assets are considered valuable, and we will treat them accordingly. Look for a new approach that has been greatly neglected in the past concerning our Tree Community. We are unique in Clearwater and Clearwater is nationally recognized for being the Tree City. So, be proud and be thankful! Watch for the upcoming Townhall meeting with our Arborist, John Snow. He will answer questions and let you know of the treasures we have within Mission Hills.

This board has no loyalty to names, positions, or services – but is loyal only to objective facts and truth. As your fiduciary ("a person to whom property or power is entrusted for the benefit of another") we are determined to sort out what is performing and adding value (**Nice vs. Needed**) as it applies to insurance coverage, management performance, maintenance labor requirements, supplies, amenities, tools & machinery, vendor loyalty, and attitudes towards this unpaid board of five who are working tirelessly because we care. We are focused on what is NEEDED!

Treasurer's Report

Hello Residents. Unfortunately, we are going in the wrong direction again in July. For the month, we are over budget by \$23.672.87. For the year, we are still over by \$79,325.95 (\$23.7K worse than last month). We have 32 delinquencies this month vs 25 last month totally \$18,739.63. Many of these now sit with our attorney and this drives up our legal costs. Delinquent residents are charged back for these costs. Residents should be aware that monthly assessment delinquencies are not treated differently that special assessment delinquencies. Once these accounts go to the attorney, if funds are not received, this can lead to foreclosure. This is the same process that has been in place for many years.

We were successful in eliminating the monthly service charge on the laundry checking account. We are also working with Spectrum on surcharges and the year over increase which is higher than the contract specified. We are starting to gather information for next year's budget and a number of providers are already indicating that we will see increases (ie. Lake Doctors, Boot-a-Pest, Jani-King, City of Clearwater). Obviously, insurance and utilities are still a concern. We are over on all utilities by \$27.8K -Elec(\$.2K/Pool Electric(\$2.7K))Water(\$10.4K)Sewer (\$12.1K)Gas(\$4K). (Reserves) below. Please note that we are over \$276K on reserve spending for the year. I wish I had more positive news to share but want you to know the full picture.

Sadly, Florida is becoming a more expensive place to live but we need to continue to pay our bills.

Communications Team:

As you know, we have a mailbox in the lobby for your questions to the board. For those of you that left questions in it, we would like to thank you. Also, we get a lot of questions from the Board Blast. We bring the questions to the board meeting and share them with you here. By law, you also have the opportunity to ask questions at the end of the meeting. The only difference is that the questions at the Board Meeting must be related to the agenda. The questions you send to the board blast, are of your choice. Just remember, we will answer your questions to the best of our ability and it will be the truth.

We received emails beginning with "I heard a rumor", or Someone told me", "it was brought to my attention", or similar. Like I said, we will answer them to the best of our abilities and we will always tell you the truth.

We were questioned about the minutes: I was told they were not done properly, too long, unable to be read, and not posted on the Portal on time. Since I'm the one doing minutes (Cheryl) I had to do some research on this one. Some minutes were removed from the portal by Ameritech because they were published with confidential information. I learned of that last week. The minutes are back on the portal in sequential order. In trying to improve myself, I looked through old Mission Hills board minutes and I didn't find any specific standards. Also, I looked online as well and the minutes seem to vary from association to association and person to person. Personally, I try to put as much information as possible without being lengthy for those that are not in the meeting, it might not please some but it's a personal choice. Also, I placed the latest copies in a binder in front of the office for those that don't have access to the portal. The minutes will always also be posted on the bulletin board by the pool.

The other "rumor" was regarding outsourcing. We have not outsourced anyone. During my tenure with the previous board, an arborist was hired; since we never had one on staff he can't be considered outsourced. You are aware that in Phase I, 15 trees were targeted for removal, the arborist determined that we only needed the removal of 2. They have been removed at this time. The arborist report showed specific pruning of the rest of the 13 trees. This pruning will begin by an outside company next week. This decision was done by the board since our crew does not have that level of expertise, the equipment, the gear, or the insurance to protect them. This process saved the community \$5,900 from the Phase I budgeted Special Assessments.

The next question was regarding Compliance. Please note that from the original 350 violations done by Ameritech in March, this board narrowed them to a hand full, and mainly, they are trees against the building walls that cause damage to the structure. If damage were to occur it is a cost that the rest of the residents will have to incur on repairs. The previous board started this process with Jim Mateka and we are continuing with the beautification and protection of Mission Hills' aesthetics and infrastructure. We are offering a lot of help in order to accomplish this. Please reach out to one of us for help if needed.

Green Team:

Since we have an arborist doing a study on the whole property, this team has been unable to do much work at this time. We hope that when he is done, we can organize the team again.

Cost Cutting Team: (Resource Team)

A member of the Cost Cutting Team conducted a study on the pool expenditures and its history. The analysis has been posted on the bulletin board by the pool and a copy will be available with Sue in the office. If you have any questions regarding the study, please send me an email and we'll try to answer it as soon as possible by our resident Civil Engineer Tom Hancher who conducted the study.

Another member of the Cost Cutting team did extensive research on garbage bags and found a vendor that offered the bags we need at a reduced price. The price, if approved, will be at about .27cents per bag vs .48 and 1.7 mil thickness instead of 1.0. That is a savings of \$3849 per year. These new bags will be stronger and less expensive than our present ones. We did receive a second quote from our present vendor for 38c per bag with half the quantity only.

Safety, safety, safety.

Al is championing with Ameri-tech a Safety training program for our maintenance crew. The crew uses tools and do tasks that require continuing education for safety. They are looking for the best training we can offer them and they can take advantage of. Part of keeping them safe was the sale of the lift "boom" truck. In order to drive that kind of truck, there are special operational requirements and insurance Mission Hills does not have which puts residents and the crew's lives at risk.






CHAIR EXERCISE


EMAIL BLAST

4 slices sourdough bread halved


Instructions

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




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


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
