We started off the year on a positive note!! Revenue was \$293,729.22. Expenses were \$257,530.40. Year to date, we are \$36,198.82 under budget!! Delinquencies are \$15,965.03. We were over budget this month on Building Supplies and plumbing repairs. We also had several roof repairs. Safety inspections were over this month but we don't pay for those each month and it will adjust during the year. Legal costs have increased. We are doing well on administrative costs and Utilities so far. Cable TV/Internet is slightly over and we have contacted Spectrum for an explanation. The operating contingency was not posted this month and will be adjusted next month.



# Weight Watchers French Onion Chicken Bake (pulled from Face Book by Helen J. Strupczewski) This oh, so yummy Weight-watchers recipe is only 2 points per serving!

### Ingredients

6 (4 oz.) chicken breast, raw

1/4 tsp paprika

1/4 tsp garlic powder

1/4 tsp seasoned salt

1 Tbsp Land lakes light butter made with canola oil

1 small yellow onion, peeled & amp; sliced

1 (10 oz.) can FRENCH ONION SOUP (I use CAMPBELL'S)

1/2 cup fat-free or light mozzarella (I use Market Pantry reduced-fat mozzarella)

### Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees.
- 2. In a skillet pan (or cast iron grill skillet) melt butter and add sliced onions.
- 3. Saute the onions in butter until softened and translucent.
- 4. When onions become soft, place onions on a plate and set them aside.
- 5. Using the same skillet, spray the skillet with non-stick cooking spray.
- Season each chicken breast with paprika, garlic powder, and seasoned salt.

Place seasoned chicken breasts into a prepared skillet. Cook for 5-7 minutes on medium-high, on both sides or until chicken breasts are golden brown.

- 7. Add onions back into the skillet with the chicken breasts.
- 8. Pour in the can of French onion soup.
- 9. Simmer the chicken and onions in the soup for 2-3 minutes-this will allow the soup to caramelize the chicken.
- 10. If using a CAST IRON SKILLET PAN top each chicken breast with light mozzarella cheese. (otherwise-transfer chicken, onions, and sauce into an ovensafe baking dish and top with light mozzarella cheese.)
- 11. Place a skillet or baking dish in a preheated oven.
- 12. Cook for 10-15 minutes or until bubbly.
- 2 Points® per serving (one chicken breast)

We are hearing reports of people washing cars and cleaning patios using the "free" water. Well, it's not really free...we all pay for it one way or another.



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
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
