This tragedy brought back the best of Mission Hills and its people. As soon as the Clubhouse had power and it was verified that it was safe to use, the residents went to work by cooking meals on Saturday and Sunday for those without power.

We verified the pool was safe and it was also opened.

Only the north laundry room was operational; we offered free \$5.00 worth of quarters to allow residents to do a load of washing.

We were blessed once again by being visited by the National Guard; they brought MREs (Meals Ready to Eat) water, and their goodwill.

Heather Feit and Christine Picard got to work to receive help from FEMA. Ron is working on assistance as well.

During Hurricane Milton, it was heartening to witness the camaraderie and neighborly support that emerged amidst the chaos. For some, this sense of community is a daily occurrence, but for others, it may not be as common. That is why, as we enter this Thanksgiving season, I encourage everyone who may have had disagreements with thou neighbors to press the reset button.

This is a time for thanks, atonement, prayer, forgiveness, and reflection — however you may define it in your personal beliefs or practices. In many faiths, the pursuit of truth is central, and as it is said, "the truth shall set you free." So, let us embrace this moment to seek understanding, harmony, and Unity in the Community, the good of Mission Hills way.

In this Thanksgiving, we give thanks for everything we have received and for the blessing of not having had any loss of life during two hurricanes and a storm.


### September Financial Report

This month Expenses exceeded Revenues. Revenues were \$264,771 and Expenses were \$302,952. Year-to-date Revenues \$2,477,991 and Year-to-date Expenses \$2,311,141 making Revenue exceeding Expenses by \$166,849.

You might understand that tree trimming and removal is a concern. This was budgeted to be \$10,979 for the year, as of September 30th we had expended nearly \$1,200. However this does not include the removal of trees and branches from either hurricane. We haven't received all of the invoices from Helene, but we estimated the cost is likely to be \$10,000. We do not have an estimate for Milton as of yet, but it is likely to be several times greater than costs for Helene.

FEMA may assist COAs with the removal of trees for emergency access and for branch and debris removal. I've had to call a friend, at home on a Saturday night, who works for FEMA, to get any attention. He has gotten me in touch with Jason Susalla, an attorney with Bay Area Legal Services. Jason will help us file claims for each hurricane at no cost. Also our Property Manager has initiated a claim for damages covered by insurance.



### News and More...

Heather and Christine Picard began researching information to apply for FEMA subsidies, made a flyer, and an army of volunteers distributed it home-to-home. They instructed the board to announce it on the board blast, and the board complied. Also, it was posted on FB. More information is coming your way.

Ron has been actively researching potential subsidies through FEMA and reached out to **DisasterRe-lief.org**, a volunteer organization that provides assistance during times of disaster. This nonprofit connects those in need with local volunteer organizations. It was created by a member of the **Mormon Church**. When individuals call the helpline, their cases are "claimed" by various local nonprofit organizations, churches, or groups that operate in the affected area.

The assistance we received came from the **Volunteer Ministers of the local Church of Scientology**, who worked with Rod on the cleanup of Flint Drive. We are hopeful that they will continue supporting our recovery efforts as we work to restore our community.

If you attended our last board meeting, you were introduced to changes in the Board of Directors. Doug Kuchle has resigned as a Member-at-Large; we are thankful for his contribution; he has helped Mission Hills with a lot of projects and saved residents a lot of money. He agreed to continue collaborating with the board as a consultant.

Pat Banning agreed to join the board as a secretary, and Rod Halvorson will be our new Member-atlarge.

- 3) I served as a member of the Iowa House of Representatives for 16 years (1979-1995) and the Iowa Senate for 4 years (1995-1999).
- 4)I was a Real Estate Salesman for 14 years (1976-1993).
- 5) I graduated from Minnesota State University Moorhead with a BA in Business Administration and a minor in Political Science. I attended graduate school at NDSU in Fargo and Drake University in Des Moines and studied Community and Regional Planning and Public Administration.

In closing, Cyndi and I look forward to meeting and getting to know you all. You can often find us out walking around the complex, swimming in the pool or playing pickleball on the nearby courts!

**Hi my name is Pat Banning** and I am the new Mission Hills Board Secretary. I live at 2975 Feather Dr. You may also know me by the nickname given to me by my kids and grandkids Jelly Momster.

While I am a relatively new year rounder here in the Hills I actually have deep roots here as my mom, Peg Daly lived here from 1986 until she died at the age of 96 and was well known for still riding a 2 wheel bike every day at 95! My brother Bill Dennehy and his wife Cyndee also live here in winters so it's a family affair. On a personal note I am a widow of many years and the mom of 3 beautiful daughters and 4 grandchildren who invade Mission Hills quite often.

On a professional level I have led a varied employment path. I began at Connecticut Yankee Nuclear Plant in 1978 as a records technician and some 20 years later was happy to run the department as the plant was retired. ### DID YOU KNOW THAT ...

... only household garbage should be in the green garbage cans near your condo. Any large items that you are disposing of - furniture, plant materials, old rugs, household items, etc. need to be taken to the maintenance area on the second or fourth Tuesday of the month. The maintenance staff cannot handle gathering all those items on their regular garbage collection days. Items for recycling - cans, paper, plastic, and glass - should be placed in the yellow bins in a carport area near your condo and garbage cans.

... the city of Clearwater requires that all dryer vents must be vented to the outside. You may not run the long silver tubes through your condo either. They must be properly vented. Also, the vents need to be cleaned out every other year. If the lint in the tubes builds up, it could cause a fire so be sure to have them cleaned on a regular basis.
