From the President's Desk

As we know, Mission Hills has an aging infrastructure that requires constant attention. Our community has 21 gas water heaters, 10 of which are around a decade old; and 88 roofs that will soon need replacing, and carports. Additionally, we have extensive asphalt areas that require maintenance. Despite these challenges, we are fortunate to enjoy a beautiful landscape and various activities that enhance our community life. The board is committed to maintaining our facilities while maintaining quality, but we need your help.

We need your help to balance these priorities effectively. If you are considering running for the board next year, we encourage you to step forward now. Joining us early allows for a smoother transition and enables us to work together to keep Mission Hills thriving. Your involvement can make a significant difference in ensuring our community remains a wonderful, peaceful, and harmonious place to live.

I would like to thank Jules Vickers for his assistance in reformatting the post. Your input is very much appreciated.

REMINDERS

- Bob walks around and takes pictures of areas out of compliance. During the summer months, the pressure washing and weed growth will be paused due to heavy rain. It will resume in the winter season. In the meantime, please look for items to be stored or discarded.
- Do not park on the grass. We have a high expenditure on irrigation supplies due to this practice.
- We are a NO PET COMMUNITY. Please do not "dog sit" for a friend. Your animal must be registered in the office as either a service animal or emotional support. No other animals or pets are allowed on the property.
- Animals must be walked on a leash and owners must pick up after their business. We had a lot of reports of animals running loose and their poop not being picked up. The maintenance department is unintentionally running over your animal's poop, damaging the blades and the tires, and spreading their feces everywhere. This is creating a very unhealthy environment for everyone. For your animal's sake, please walk it with a lease and pick up after they are done
- Please rinse your body after swimming by the pool shower before using the bathroom shower. It has been very hard to clean due to body oil residue.
- We have received reports of residents cohabitating with more people than allowed by law. If you have guests staying with you, they cannot reside in your condo for more than three weeks in a 6 month Period. without completing a background check for \$40.00. By law, only two people per bedroom are allowed in each unit.
- Make sure license plates are current. Several warnings have been issued to some residents. A few are
 driving on the road with expired tags. It is a matter of law, we don't want to tow anyone's car. Thank
 you for your cooperation.

Treasurer's Report

In June, we had difficult month. Revenue was \$254,289. Expenses were \$258,517. For the month we were \$2,480 over budget. At the mid-point of the year, we are \$112,051 under budget.

Part of the reason we were over budget for the month is that we were short by \$22,854 in collecting maintenance fees raising delinquencies to \$30,797, up substantially since April when delinquencies were reported to be \$23,742.95. Also the Rec. Bldg cleaning service was paid twice, this should balance out in the month of July.

We continue to build reserves by \$35,573.08 a month.

Utilities tend to change from month-to-month during the year based on occupancy. So, electricity, water, sewer, trash and gas were all under budget for the month. And all except water are under budget for the year. Water is over budget by nearly \$8,000 at year-to-date. However we have 3 more low cost months to correct this before the Snowbirds arrive.

The most troublesome number in the budget is the line item for repairs to the Hot Water Heaters, pumps, and lines. As of June 30th this line item is fully expended. We have 10 Water Heater between 9-12 years of age. Considering the age of these units and our recent experience, we have adopted a replacement cycle and will look at increasing this line item in next year's budget. Cheryl has suggested we have replacement parts on-hand. The delays we have experienced in getting parts delivered have caused residents to be without hot water for far too long. We hope the implementing of these changes can reduce these inconveniences.





FROM THE COMMUNICATIONS TEAM:

The following are some of the questions that were brought up to the board by email or by mail. As always, we share them during our board meeting and it will be open for questions at the end of the meeting for follow-up. I will list a few of the questions below but the full Q&A will be posted on the bulletin board and will be sent to you by email.

Addressing the Board:

The board is a group of owners with the fiduciary responsibility to represent the membership. We make every effort to answer all your questions and correspondence, follow up, and execute any issues that might come up. Please be respectful when addressing the board, just as you would like the board to address you. It is very difficult to respond to disrespectful and anonymous mail.

Please be professional, and give us your name and phone number so we can call you back, address your concerns, and gather more information if needed to resolve the issue; emails are best.

Flags on property

In Florida, the ability to display political flags in a condo community largely depends on the rules set by the homeowners association (HOA) or condo association. While Florida law specifically permits the display of certain flags, such as the U.S. flag and flags representing military branches, it does not explicitly address political flags1

HOAs and condo associations can ban political signs and flags.

If you're considering displaying a political flag, it's best to review the condo association's rules or consult with the board to understand any restrictions that may apply.

Signs on property:

Someone express the need for directional signs on our property in order to better help with deliveries and emergency vehicles. We looked into it last year and found they were very expensive, at that time there was no money in the budget to address this issue.

Becky Anderson is spearheading the issue and needs residents to form a team to address the issue of signs and work towards a solution. If there are volunteers interested in taking this on, we would greatly appreciate your help. Also, if you feel that you need additional signaling for the EMT or deliveries to find your unit, please let me know and I will forward the message to her.

Motorcycles on property:

Motorcycles are prohibited by Mission Hills bylaws. We had a proposal during the last election to change the bylaws but it didn't pass, so nothing has changed. Only four motorcycles are authorized to park on the property, and the designated parking area is by SR 590, as stated in the P&P. Letters have been sent from our attorney to those who violate the rules, and the issue is being addressed. We are a COA, not an HOA; the applicable Florida law for COAs is FS 718, along with the new law HB 1021.

Beautification Team:

Pat Banning has offered to help residents with beautification needs. Please reach out to her at 860-882-2215. If anyone would like to help her with beautification, please contact her.

Newsletter distribution:

We had decided not to deliver the Post anymore except to those who asked specifically for it to be delivered. It was not a welcomed idea! The other option for those of you that don't want the Post delivered, is to place a sign on the mailbox signaling the volunteer to skip you. Unless anyone has a better idea.

Google Review:

Our Google score is 4.1. Remember that the higher the review, the better for those who would like Mission Hills to be the community of choice. If you love Mission Hills, please go online and give Mission Hills a 5-star review. Some of the reviews are old but they still bring the score down.

The other entertainment equipment we have available is a pool table/ping pong table converter. We just purchased ping pong balls for your enjoyment; please count them at the end of your game to ensure they are all accounted for.

Please be kind to all the equipment available and after you are done, keep it clean for the next residents' use.

The room is maintained by your C.O.A. and is for the enjoyment of residents and their guests only. Users must be 18 years and older to use the facility and must be accompanied by a resident.

Mission Hills Swimming Pool

The Mission Hills property and pool are private-use facilities for members and their guests. Pool rules are posted in the pool area. Please take the time to read them and always keep safety in mind while at the pool.

Club use is a privilege afforded to all dues-paying members of the Mission Hills Condo Association. All residents should be able to enjoy our clubhouse and pool without having anyone ruining their day. The club property is under 24-hour video surveillance. If you see something, say something. If you observe any suspicious behavior on the property, don't hesitate to get in touch with the property management company, the office during business hours, or the police. Do not engage with violators. Stay safe!

How to make lemon pepper salmon

In a small bowl, whisk together minced garlic, black pepper, lemon juice, melted butter or olive oil, salt and lemon zest.


Add the salmon fillets to a cast iron pan or baking sheet and pour the sauce on top. Take a brush to spread the mixture on evenly. It will pool around the sides of the salmon which is ok.


Take 1 extra lemon and slice into thin strips. Place on top of each fillet and top with additional black pepper, lemon zest or salt if desired. Let sit to marinate while the oven finishes heating.

Bake for 12-18 minutes, depending on the thickness of the salmon and your preference of "doneness."

I like salmon well done and my fillets were somewhat thick, so I did 18 minutes, but check it at 12. It should flake easily and peel right off the skin.

Serve with quinoa, rice, cauliflower rice, my gluten free risotto and any green veggies such as steamed broccoli or asparagus. I also love to drizzle everything with my homemade basil pesto vinaigrette.







Hello Mission Hills Neighbors!

My name is Tina Hans and I've lived in our community 15 years! It's an old community, but I fell in love right from the start. Because of the age of our community, we have seen increases in our COA fees and have had to come up with some assessments, as well. My concern is for some homeowners that just can't pay the fees. They've been residents here for many years and now can no longer afford to live here. And they have no place to go.

Some of us can afford an extra \$20 per month. We have 477 units here. If 100 of us would contribute \$20 per month, that would be \$2,000 a month and would go a long way to take care of neighbors that may be in danger of losing their homes.

There is a white lockbox on the wall outside the office. Can you put \$20 a month in there? It would be completely anonymous. I will work with Ameritech to see that the money goes to the right place. I've already put my \$20 in and will do so every month. I don't want to see our neighbors out on the streets. Can we be good neighbors and help them out? Thanks so much!
