

But, we will do it one more time.

Jone is leaving a legacy of what a Condo board treasure should be and looks like, and we have taken note. I will miss her, she has been a fountain of knowledge for us. We hope we can fill her shoes somehow.

At all times, this board strives to keep our emotions balanced and our authority in check. While the law grants us certain powers, we constantly question our ethics before making any decision. The needs of the many outweigh the needs of the one.

More importantly, it is crucial to understand what residents want for Mission Hills. How do YOU see the future of Mission Hills?

But, we can only do so much. Now, YOU have to think about what is next. What do you want Mission Hills to look like in the future? What kind of community do you want to live in? THAT, will be up to you.

Treasurer's Report

I wanted to say goodbye to all of you! I will miss you. My unit sold very quickly and legally I have to step down as the treasurer. I sincerely believe that Mission Hills is in position to have a good year financially. The current board watches the spending carefully and will continue to do so.

In April, we had a great month! Revenue was \$283,309.06. Expenses were \$261,241.97. For the month, we are \$22,067.09 under budget. Year to date, we are \$91,035.30 <u>under</u> budget! Delinquencies are \$23,742.95 and we have one account being handled by the attorney. Another account was paid in full after the financials came out. Year to date, we are over on utilities. Water and sewer are over \$7751.49 combined because of long running toilets that were discovered. Legal is over \$4,942.92 this month. This is due to a posting error. Funds for the attorney for the lawsuit should have come from reserves. This was corrected by Ameritech and will be reflected in the May Financials.

From the Welcome Team:

We would like to welcome our new residents to Mission Hills: Evelyn Matos, Christine Gralton, Daniel & Lisa Thompson, Sandra Kallin, Patricia Peres and Joan Sharp. If you see them, please welcome them to Mission Hills.

Updates to remember:

As you know, we have a work order process through the website. It is used quite a bit, and we encourage residents to utilize it. It saves you time from going into the office, and requests are handled promptly.

We have hired a new cleaning company, and I hope you notice the difference. They are working on a month-to-month basis with no specific scope. This means we can tell them what needs to be cleaned, and they will do it. We have committed to using their services for three months or until we can find personnel to do it in-house.

The subject of the pool bathrooms came up and the showers have a lot of oil and are hard to keep clean. Please use the shower by the pool for rinsing before showering in the bathroom.

We have discussed the Team concept in the past, and we are still committed to it. We invite those who are interested to come forward, organize it, and take leadership. Mike Spooner has reviewed the trees report and received some training on this matter; he could use help. Heather has championed assistance for residents and received training on hurricane preparedness; she could also use help. Previously, a resident helped with plumbing issues, and now we need an electrician to assist with electrical consultations for the clubhouse. If you have electrical experience, please contact us.

We are **still looking for at least five neighborhood watch volunteers**; it requires only one hour per month. Additionally, **we need a volunteer to unlock and lock the pool.** The person who was handling this is out of town, and we need someone to take over. All this volunteer work is very helpful.

We hope residents will step up to avoid hiring outside companies for these tasks. Hiring a surveillance company or someone to lock the pool is costly. We ask for your help. Please contact Susan Salesses, and she will train you for the neighborhood watch.

Some housekeeping items.

- 1. Ensure you fumigate your units for termites, roaches, ants, etc. This will help the community with unnecessary termite tenting. Its cost could run anywhere from \$5,000 to 6,000 dollars.
- Do not bury trees or place any plants on the ground. Use only pots. Always check with the service department.
- 3. While the crew is working on the wood, please ensure that plants and pots are not close to the building to provide them with enough space to work.
- 4. Do not use outside water except for light watering of pots. No pressure washing. That is city water and is expensive. Save water!
- 5. Lock the trash bins after being used to avoid Wilde animals getting into them.
- 6. Don't feed Wilde animals.
- 7. Place recycling items in the correspondent bin
- 8. Avoid the disposal of needles, glass, or items that may cause injury to the crew while picking up the trash.
- 9. Do not park on the grass. We have a high expenditure on irrigation supplies due to this practice.
- 10. We are a NO PET COMMUNITY. Please do not "dog sit" for a friend. Your animal must be registered in the office as either a service animal or emotional support. No other animals or pets are allowed on the property.
- 11. Animals must be walked on a leash and owners must pick up after your animal.

DID YOU KNOW THAT . . .

... water to your unit must be turned off in your absence and your AC must be kept no higher than 78 degrees? The water needs to be turned off in case of leaks or water issues and the AC must be kept on to prevent mold from growing in your condo and possibly spreading to your neighbors. It is a good idea to follow this practice even if you are going away just for the weekend. However, it definitely needs to be done if you are going away for a week or more.

... it's hurricane season as of June 1? Be sure that you have supplies ready, just in case. Also remember that everything on your front and back patios MUST be brought inside if there is a threat of a storm coming our way. This includes large plants and patio furniture, and anything that could "fly away" in a storm. We do not want items hitting the windows of our neighbors.

Thank you to everyone who leaves their front light on from dusk to dawn! We have so many residents now participating in this program to keep our neighborhood safe from intruders and well-lit for the safety of our neighbors. If you drive around Mission Hills at night, you can certainly see a difference. Please encourage your neighbors to keep their lights on if they do not already do so. And, dusk to dawn lights remain for sale at \$5 a bulb. Contact Susan at 727-754-8421 if you need a bulb.

It is hard to believe, but schools are now closed for the summer. We tend to have more teens and people walking our streets at this time of year. Be sure that your car and condo doors are locked at night and bikes and anything valuable outside should also be locked up. Remember, if you see anything or anyone suspicious, call the non-emergency number for the police 727-562-4242 to make a report.




Grilled Skirt Steak Caprese By Bobby Flay

FOR THE VINAIGRETTE:

- 1/2 cup balsamic vinegar
- 2 teaspoons dijon mustard
- √ 1/4 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1/2 cup canola oil



- 2 pounds skirt steak, halved lengthwise
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 4 ounces baby arugula
- 1 small red onion, halved and thinly sliced
- 4 ripe beefsteak tomatoes, thinly sliced




Instructions:

- 1. Make the vinaigrette: Whisk together the vinegar, mustard, salt and pepper in a medium bowl. While whisking, slowly drizzle in the oil and whisk until emulsified. Set aside.
- 2. Place the steak in a baking dish. Add half the vinaigrette and turn to coat; let the steak sit at room temperature for 30 minutes.
- 3. Heat a grill to high or a grill pan over high heat on top of the stove.
- 4. Remove the steak from the marinade and pat dry. Season both sides with salt and pepper. Grill until lightly charred on both sides and just cooked to medium-rare doneness, about 4 minutes per side. Transfer the steak to a cutting board and let rest for 5 minutes.
- 5. Meanwhile, mix the arugula and red onion in a large bowl. Add some of the remaining vinaigrette and toss to coat. Season with salt and pepper.

Thinly slice the steak across the grain and arrange it on a platter with the tomatoes. Serve with the arugula salad.
