Maintenance Report

Roof cleaning is beginning so no, those aren't Santa's reindeer you hear on the roof! It's Oscar and his crew.

The lawns have been cleaned of leaves and they have been removed for the most part. That is an ongoing project.

Drains have been cleaned and repaired... If you have a drainage issue please fill out a work order. We are not often out in the rain so try to get a video if possible for the staff to observe.

The repair and replacement of the hardy board in the front and back of units is ongoing. If you think you have an issue, please put in a work order.

Tree stumps are scheduled to be ground and filled within the next 2 weeks. Once that is completed we will assess the budget and begin trimming and potential removal of trees.

Please be aware of anything you put down your drain... Remember this is a drainage system and everything is intertwined. What one condo does will affect many.

We also have a very low financial cost to repair our equipment here at the hills because our multitalented group of workers maintains the equipment... daily pm and major overhauls.


Below is a drawing from Jose showing what happens when we plant things in the ground. We need to be very aware of where the drains are and potential hazards. Pots are best! Remember, NO

planting of trees of any kind is allowed by residents. They will be removed by maintenance.

A few important changes:


Going forward, ALL work MUST have a work order filled out. There will be no more calling the Maintenance Team's personal cell phones, or stopping them when spotted around campus. They have been informed of this procedure as well. Work orders can be done online, or in the office. They are out there with task lists already in progress, and stopping them puts us all behind.

Also, nobody is allowed behind the maintenance gate. It does not matter if it is open, or if you have been there before. It is a NO ENTER area.

February Financial Report



Many of our owners have not corrected the January COA fees. If you have not, the correct additional amount is \$22.74 for 1 and 1s, \$28.40 for 2 and 2s, \$26.70 for 2 and 1s, and \$26.920 for 2 and 1 Specials. You can make payment by mail to Ameri-Tech or by dropping a check off at the office.

Now nine (9) accounts are in the hands of the attorney for collections, two were added this month. Six (6) more appear to be very close to being 60 days late and additional accounts may be added to collections without payment this month. Arrears continue to climb now at \$54,242.20, of which \$365.55 are unpaid 2022 Special Assessments.



Please take notice that beginning May 1, 2025 a \$25 fee will be added to any outstanding maintenance fees.

Easter Jello Pie

A very festive and light treat for after that Honey Baked Ham and Deviled Eggs spread.

<u>Ingredients:</u>

1 pre-made graham cracker crust

1 (3 oz) box lemon Jell-o

1 (3 oz) box grape Jell-o

1 (3 oz) box berry blue Jell-o

3 cups boiling water (1 cup per Jell-o flavor)

3 cups cold water (1 cup per Jell-o flavor

8 oz cream cheese, softened

1 1/2 cups whipped topping

Whipped cream, pastel sprinkles, and candy eggs for decoration



<u>Directions:</u>

Prepare the lemon layer: Dissolve lemon Jell-o in 1 cup boiling water, then add 1 cup cold water. Let it cool slightly, then mix in 1/3 of the cream cheese and 1/2 cup whipped topping. Pour into the graham cracker crust and refrigerate for 30 minutes.

Prepare the blue layer: Repeat the process with berry blue Jell-o, layering it gently over the set lemon layer. Refrigerate for another 30 minutes.

Prepare the grape layer: Repeat the process with grape Jell-o, pouring it on top of the blue layer. Chill for at least 4 hours or until fully set.

Decorate with whipped cream, pastel sprinkles, and candy eggs before serving.

Prep time: 15 minutes * Chill time: 4 hours 30 minutes * Total time: 4 hours 45 minutes

Kcal: 250 per slice * Servings: 8 slices

Tips:

Use a spoon to gently pour each layer to prevent mixing.

For a lighter texture, fold extra whipped topping into each layer.
