January Financial Report

For January Revenues exceeded Expenses. Revenues were \$288,460 and Expenses were \$254,466. A difference of \$33,994.

More than 80% of our owners have corrected the January COA fees. If you have not, the correct amount is \$22.74 for 1 and 1s, \$28.40 for 2 and 2s, \$26.70 for 2 and 1s, and \$26.90 for 2 and 1 Specials. You can make payment by mail to Ameritech or by dropping a check off at the office. These amounts will be in the post so there is no need to write them down.




